ECG's PowerLine School is the culmination of years of field experience and countless hours of applied classroom training. ECG's comprehensive training courses incorporate **'Safety First'** while challenging and preparing the Electrical Lineworker for advancement.

Our 3-year *PowerLine Workers Apprenticeship Program* is designed to enhance the knowledge and skills of utility employees in this field. The program is **certified by the U.S. Department of Labor** and has proven to be beneficial and rewarding to both the students and their employers who have taken advantage of this remarkable training program.

ACADEMICS

Three hands-on and classroom training events lasting five days each and scheduled one year apart. Also included are self study units with timed examinations that are given throughout the program.

Students provide their own tools and personal protective equipment for the hands-on training sessions. All textbooks are provided, which include:
