Request Approval on Funding Requirements Related to FY22 Budgeted Pension Plan and 401K Plan Modifications

John Giles informed the Board that ECG has been notified that the 401K Plan Modifications recently approved by the Board for the employees, also require ECG to go back retroactively to January 1, 2022 (ECG is on a calendar year for the 401K Plan) and make any applicable ECG contributions up to the new 6% Plan Funding requirements. This retroactive funding is around \$37,000. John asked the Board to consider approving the

\$43,700 that was budgeted and collected during the FY22 billing process to fund the pension plan, (which we have been advised is not required) now be applied to fund the retroactive 401K Plan contributions with the remaining balance be applied to the Year End Settlement.

On motion by Jeff Lewis and seconded by Tim Houston, the Board approved using the \$43,700 that was budgeted and collected during the FY22 billing process to be applied to fund the retroactive 401K Plan contributions with the remaining balance be applied to the Year End Settlement.

# Approval of the Fiscal Year 2023 Budgeted Applied Rates

John Giles has the Board to consider approving the hourly rate of \$300 for Non-Subscribed Services and ECG Employee Benefit Rate for Mutual Assistance be 40%.

On motion by Craig Mims and seconded by Lamar Hill, the Board approved the FY23 hourly rate for approved Other Services request of \$300 per hour and the 40% ECG Staff mutual Aid Rate for Benefits.
